# Zev, Feuer, School Board Candidates To Speak at May 13, Annual Meeting

Supervisor Zev Yaroslavsky, Councilman Mike Feuer, and the two candidates for Board of Education, Valerie Fields and Ken Sackman, will address the Tract No. 7260 Association Annual Meeting on May 13.

The meeting will take place in the Social Hall of St. Timothy's Church just west of Beverly Glen on Pico Blvd.) at 7 p.m.

**Prior to the meeting all 7260 members are invited to a dinner catered by the Stage Deli. The dinner will be served from 6 to 7 p.m. in the Social Hall. Cost: \$3.**

Supervisor Yaroslavsky will discuss how the County affects Tract 7260. Councilman Feuer will cover subjects ranging from the possible loss of 7260's historic lampposts, to the proposed JMB 38 story, 800,000 square foot Century City hi-rise.

## **School Board Candidates**

Fields and Sackman will outline the issues that have marked their campaign. Those issues include the breakup of the school district, class sizes and low reading and math scores. The two emerged as finalists in the school board election after a hard fought primary race eliminated two other candidates. Fields, a former teacher, was a deputy to Mayor Bradley. Sackman, an attorney, is a graduate of the USC Law School.

## **RSVP**

**7260 members are urged to RSVP to 277-6505 for the dinner. However, an RSVP is not necessary. There should be enough food for all members who attend the dinner between 6 and 7 p.m.**

Members who can should bring a dessert for the dessert table but are not obligated to do so. The price of the meal has been set at only \$3 per person due to the generosity of the Stage Deli, which is providing the dinner at its cost and to the fact that some of the dinner costs are being picked up by 7260. (Members may bring guests who will be charged \$6.)

On the buffet menu are turkey, corned beef, roast beef, the Stage Deli's famous tuna fish salad, cole slaw, pickles, condiments, soft drinks, desserts, and coffee.

**The dinner is open only to 7260 members and their guests. (A member is anyone living in a house for which dues have been paid. Unpaid dues can be turned in at the door.) The business meeting starts at 7 p.m. and is free and open to the public.**

Also, a City representative will preview the City's plan for stream-lining the recycling program so that cans, glass, plastics and paper can be mixed in the same container.

Elections for members of 7260's Board of Directors will take place at the meeting.
