

Secession Debate to Highlight 7260 Annual Meeting

“Should the Valley, Hollywood, and the Harbor area secede from the City of Los Angeles?” will be the subject of a debate at the annual meeting of the Tract No. 7260 Association. Also on the agenda will be reports on Crime, the demolition of the ABC Entertainment Center, and the reconfiguration of Santa Monica Blvd. The meeting will take place on Wednesday, May 8, 2002, at the Social Hall of St. Timothy’s Church (just west of Beverly Glen on Pico Blvd.) at 7:30 p.m.

Stage Deli Dinner

Prior to the meeting, all Tract No. 7260 members and their guests are invited to a dinner catered by the Stage Deli. The dinner will be served from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m.

Jeff Brain, President of Valley Vote, the organization that succeeded in obtaining the thousands of signatures needed to put valley secession on the June ballot, will speak in favor of the secession of the Valley, Hollywood, and the Harbor area from the City of Los Angeles.

Opposed will be Larry Levine, the political consultant who headed the successful campaigns for City Council of both Mike Feuer and Jack Weiss.

Decreasing Crime Rates

Crime is up all over the city—including West Los Angeles—and an officer from the West Los Angeles Division of the LAPD will discuss the increasing crime rates on the West Side. He will also tell what 7260 residents can do to combat crime within the Tract.
