Annual Meeting set for Tuesday, May 15 Feuer Will Take on Hi-Rise; Zev Will Tackle Subways Stage Deli Dinner Will Be Served before Meeting

Councilman Mike Feuer will discuss his opposition to the proposed Constellation Place, a 38 story, 704,000 square foot hi-rise in Century City adjacent to Fox Hills Drive. And Supervisor Zev Yaroslavsky will talk about his ballot measure to kill future subway construction in Los Angeles

Yaroslavsky and Feuer will be the main speakers at Tract No. 7260's annual meeting on Tuesday, May 19, 1998, at the Social Hall of St. Timothy's Church (just west of Beverly Glen on Pico Blvd.) at 7:30 p.m.

Prior to the meeting all 7260 members and their guests are invited to a dinner catered by the Stage Deli. The dinner will be served from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. During his talk. Councilman Feuer also will suggest actions that 7260 members can take to limit the Constellation Place project. He will provide an update on the city's plans to replace 7260's historic lampposts and explain such Fox Studio traffic mitigations as the installation of a three-way stop light at Beverly Glen and Pico and of speed humps proposed for Fox Hills Drive and possibly for Kerwood Avenue.

Crime Report

Also speaking at the meeting will be Captain Dave Smith, new head of the West Los Angeles Police. Captain Smith will provide information about the declining number of crimes in Tract 7260 as well as in the entire Westside. He will also present information about the most common crimes within 7260 and tell how they can be prevented.

An additional speaker will provide information about the recent secession movement to break up Los Angeles into two or more cities.

7260 members are urged to RSVP to 277-6505 for the dinner. Members who can are asked to bring a dessert for the dessert table but are not obligated to do so.

The price of the meal has been set at only \$3 per person due to the generosity of the Stage Deli, which is providing the dinner at its cost, and to the fact that some of the dinner costs are being picked up by 7260. (Members may bring guests, who will be charged \$6)

On the buffet menu are turkey, corned beef, roast beef, the Stage Deli's famous tuna salad, cole slaw, fresh baked rye and egg breads, pick-les, condiments, desserts, soft drinks, and coffee.

The dinner is open only to 7260 members and their guests. (A member is anyone living in a house for which dues have been paid. Unpaid dues can be turned in at the door.) The business meeting starts at 7:30 p.m. and is free and open to the public.
