A. homicide detectives are investigating the shooting death of 42 year old **Norman Field** who was shot at the Von's parking lot on National Blvd. The shooting took place on April 17, 2000, at approximately 10:48 p.m. The victim was looking into the death of his son who had been murdered four days earlier, on April 13, 2000, in South Central L.A.
